THE END OF THE UNIVERSITIES?

In fall 2011 Stanford University announced a course in Artificial Intelligence that would be available, online and free, to anyone in the world who wanted to try it; no prerequisites. 160,000 people registered. This was not the first **MOOC** (massive open online course) but it got the most publicity. In January 2012 its author left Stanford to found *Udacity*, a for-profit that would offer similar free courses. By April, 2 other Stanford faculty had created *Coursera*, a non-profit consortium of “prestigious” universities offering MOOCs. The next month, Harvard and MIT announced they were each putting up \$30 million for a venture, *edX*, which would also provide free MOOCs. The stampede continues; CU’s on board. If this is a revolution, it’s a very odd one, led by the aristocracy, not the oppressed masses. What’s going on? If Harvard online is free, why should anyone pay to go to college? Why would a venture capitalist offer \$20 million to a company whose product is free—what’s the financial model there? What did Udacity’s Sebastian Thrun mean when he said “**in 50 years there will be no more than 10 higher education institutions**”? Helen and JJ will provide the background and we expect the audience to come up with some answers!
